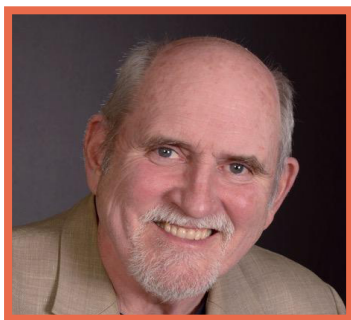

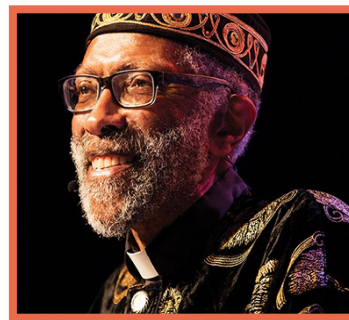

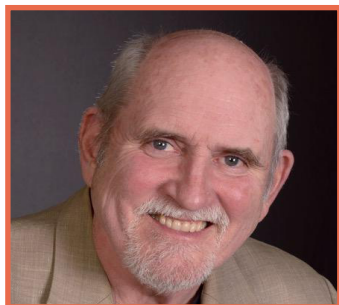

Featured Performers

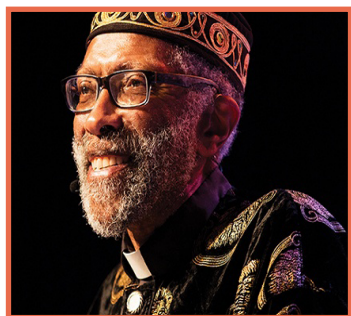
Marty Haugen is a celebrated composer who, for 40 years, has presented workshops and concerts across North and Central America, Europe, Asia and the Pacific Rim. His music appears in hymnals for U.S., Canadian and Australian Catholics, Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians and other Protestant denominations. Through his music and presentations, Haugen highlights music's role in creating community, solidarity, care for creation, and peace with justice. He has over 40 recordings and more than 400 separate printed editions available through GIA Publications. A number of his published songs, including "Shepherd Me, O God," "Gather Us In" and "All Are Welcome" are familiar to many faith traditions and justice and peace groups. Haugen's recent work "Choose to Hope," is set for release in 2019. Marty and his wife, Linda, live in Minnesota. Vallimar Jansen serves the Church as a composer, singer, storyteller, speaker and evangelizer. Known for her contemporary Christian music, including spirituals and traditional, Jansen has received critical acclaim for her solo albums, "You Gotta Move" and "Anointing," winning UNITY Awards recognition in 2008 and 2010. Jansen served as MC for the National Catholic Youth Conference in 2011 in Indianapolis and co-MC for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' gatherings at the 2016 World Youth Day in Krakow, Poland, in 2017. She also has performed in Jamaica, St. Kitts, France, Germany, Belgium, Italy, Scotland, Israel, and Japan. Vallimar's inspirational performances include her one-woman musical on the life of renowned African-American, Sister Thea Bowman, FSPA, who was endorsed for the sainthood cause by the US Bishops. Rev. Msgr. Ray East, a priest in the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C., served in six local parishes before being named Pastor of St. Teresa of Avila Church in southeast Washington. The grandson of Baptist missionaries to South Africa, East was born in Newark, New Jersey and raised in San Diego, California.



Ordained to the priesthood in 1981, Msgr. East has served in a number of leadership roles in the Archdiocese, including Director of the Office of Black Catholics and Vicar for Evangelization. He is nationally known as an inspirational speaker and activist, and an engaging facilitator and minister in worship. His history of work in civil rights, with the United Farm Workers, with Vietnam veterans and with prisoners, together with his passion and enthusiasm for equality, justice, and nonviolence have touched the souls of people of all ages, ethnicities, and faith traditions.
